

Important Information for Parents

Before You Arrive

- Check in time is 9:00am for all children's lessons.
- Ensure your children are well rested, hydrated and have had breakfast.
- A Bring them ready to ski or snowboard dressed in their snow clothing and with their boots on.
- Have your lift passes ready and in the jacket pocket. Ninja Kids passes can be claimed free of charge at Grand Hirafu Resort, you must pay a ¥1000 deposit and have your child present in order to redeem the pass.
- Lunch and drinks are provided for Ninja Kids and Yama Riders full day lessons. Limited allergy/dietary requirements can be accommodated if your child has more complex dietary needs you will need to provide lunch for them.
- Snacks in their pockets are great for a big day of riding. GoSnow is a nut free facility so please leave the snacks with nuts at home.
- All children are required to be toilet trained. Our staff are unable to change diapers/nappies.

How to dress your child for a great day

Niseko is blessed with some of the snowiest and driest powder in the world and as such has unique conditions. Weather conditions can change rapidly in the mountains. Some days will be snowy, dry and cold, some will be rainy, and others can be quite warm and sunny. Make sure you dress your child with the right clothing for the conditions.

- Helmets are required for all lessons.
- Waterproof snow jacket and pants.
- Insulated and waterproof gloves or mittens.
- Dry knee-high socks.
- Long underwear- tops and bottoms.
- Beanie.
- Goggles we recommend a good quality low light lens for Niseko's powdery conditions. Sunglasses are not recommended in Niseko. There is too much snow!
- A face mask or neck warmer.
- Layering a warm jumper under the snow jacket.

During the lesson


- Don't worry about tears! All instructors are kind, caring and trained to have your child smiling and enjoying their day in no time.
- ❖ If you wish to check in on your child, lunchtime is best. Lunch will be served from approximately 12:15pm to 1:15pm. Please check with our Guest Services team to find out where your child will be having lunch.
- If you wish to watch your child's lesson, we ask that you watch from a distance; it is harder for little ones to bond with their instructor and class if they can see you.

Know your lesson check-in location



Group lessons take place at <u>Gondola Base</u> - please allow plenty of time to make your way to the check-in location for the lesson, it is not possible to accommodate late arrivals.

Please check in for the lesson at the "Ninja Kids Meeting Area" or "Yama Riders Meeting Area" as shown in the image below.



Important information:

- Helmets are required to be worn by children in all lessons.
- An emergency contact number/WhatsApp must be provided for all children participating in the lessons. You must be always contactable during your child's lesson.
- GoSnow can accommodate limited dietary/allergy requirements. If your child has complex dietary needs, it is best to provide their own lunch & snacks.
- GoSnow is a nut free facility please leave any snacks that contain nuts at home.
- ❖ All children must be fully toilet trained to participate in GoSnow lessons.
- Late fees will be charged if your child is not collected at the designated time/area at the completion of either Group Lesson or Private lesson.

Is a Group Lesson the best option for my child?

Group lessons are a fun and social learning environment for children to learn in - this means multiple children with a variety of personalities, goals (including expectations from parents), energy levels, and abilities.

Each day, GoSnow review each child individually and place them in a group that is the most suitable for the child with respect to the big picture for that specific day. That does sometimes mean mixed ages with matched abilities, some groups are smaller than others due to skill set, and it will ALWAYS mean that there is some variation of skill level within a group.

If you have concerns about your child participating in lessons with a variation in ability levels, we encourage you to consider a Private Lesson. In this setting we can provide one-on-one attention and a lesson that moves at a pace customized to your child's ability.
